Practical steps



- Identify the representatives of each sector to craft a Presidential Health Summit compact based on the outcomes presented in this session to commit to work together to implement identified solutions
 - Government, Civil Society, Labour, Health Services Users, Business, Academia, health professionals and allied health workers
- Between now and the 1st week of December consult their key constituencies on the interventions to be implemented and craft a plan including clear objectives, method, timelines, milestones and indicators as well as financial resources to address the interventions
- Meet end of November to consolidate all the plans into a social compact
- Convene by December 10 to publicly sign the Presidential Health compact by leaders of the 8 sectors
- The Presidency will have oversight and Stewardship leading implementing government departments (Health, National Treasury, COGTA, Public Service and Administration, Public Works, Home Affairs and Science and Technology)
